■ Word of the President

The creation of the *Chambre européenne des huissiers de justice* is the result of a reflection of several years conducted by the European judicial officers on the need to build a permanent European structure to meet with the challenges set by the European Union to the profession.

Thus, it fulfills the priorities set by the European Union, which invites legal professionals to organize themselves to ensure a real cross-border legal security, in particular regarding the improvement of enforcement of judicial decisions.

Instrument of cooperation between the judicial officers, promotion of the essential role of these enforcement officers in the construction of a European area of justice to serve European litigants, the *Chambre européenne des huissiers de justice* will also seek to determine the best practices in order to facilitate the daily practice of the judicial officers, improve the functioning of justice and the citizen access to law.



■ The CEHJ

The Chambre européenne des huissiers de justice (European Chamber of Judicial Officers), abbreviated as the « CEHJ », non-profit association governed by Belgian law, was created last 24th March 2012 by the Chambre nationale des huissiers de justice de Belgique, the Chambre nationale des huissiers de justice de France, the Chambre des huissiers de justice du Grand-Duché de Luxembourg, the Associazione Ufficiali Giudiziari in Europa, which were previously at the origin of the first European project carried by judicial officers and co-financed by the European Union since 2010.

The CEHJ aims to bring together all the national bodies representing the profession of judicial and enforcement officers in the Member States of European Union, regardless of their title and beyond the differences in their status and duties assigned to them.

■ Our objectives

Participation in the strengthening and the efficiency of a European area of justice, by participating in the works performed by the EU institutions and Member States.

Improvement of access to justice for European litigants, professionals or individuals.

Promotion of the activities of the European judicial officers among the European citizens, European institutions, international organizations or third countries.

Expression of common positions submitted to the European authorities, in a consultative way, for the development and the evolution of European legislation.

Training of judicial officers to European legislative instruments.

Implementation of technical and information technology falling within the priorities of e-justice, in order to improve the efficiency of European instruments and cooperation between judicial officers, in line with the reinforcement of access to justice and better administration of justice.

■ Our activities

Contacts, exchanges and dialogues with institutions, European and International jurisdictions.

Creation of committees and working groups composed of experts, interested in various aspects of the practice of judicial officers in Europe.

Organization, promotion and financing of **conferences, training courses, meetings, conferences...**

Publication of articles, comments, analyzes, position papers, press releases, statistics, proposals of laws or regulations.

Communication including the creation of a dedicated website.

Creation of **databases, research centers and libraries.**

Overview, management, participation to **European and International projects**; support and sustainability of **European projects carried by national bodies** representing the profession of judicial officer in various Member States of the European Union.
